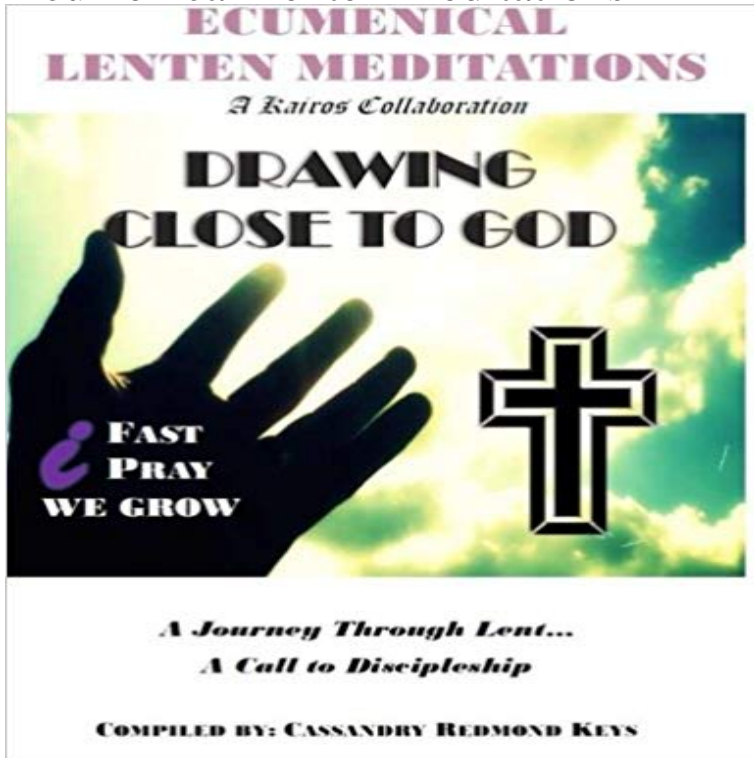


Ecumenical Lenten Meditations
